Awards, Points & Show Approvals

APPROVALS: The 2025 Cactus Classic championship show is conducted under the rules of the North American Peruvian Horse Association (NAPHA) as an APP (All Peruvian Paso) Championship Show. The show is drug free with testing (PER USEF RULES) increasing points for year-end awards. Only horses with registration certificates issued by NAPHA or the PHAC may participate. It is operated in accordance with the current official Rules and Regulations of Horse Showing and Peruvian Paso Breed Standards of NAPHA. Every person who participates in this show is responsible for knowledge of and is subject to these NAPHA rules. Rule books may be obtained at www.napha.net. A copy of the rules will be available for review at the show through the show steward and at the show office. Everything is being done to conduct the show on the highest possible standard, and for the pleasure of exhibitors and spectators. The best adjudicating officials to be found are selected and they will place awards upon the horses as they see them presented in the ring, without regard to previous records. This show will confer a minimum of double points for the NAPHA Medallon de Plata, Medallon de Oro, Medallon de Bronce, Medallon de Diamante, Zone 2 and High Point Performance Horse Awards.

NOTE: In order to receive points for this show, you must be a member of the NAPHA. Membership applications will be available in the Show Office. You may also become a member of NAPHA by registering at their website, www.NAPHA.net. The 2025 Cactus Classic is also approved by the PHAC for points.

ENTRY CHECKLIST

When you send in your entries, please check to be sure you include the following:

- (1) A completed and signed entry form (front and back).
- (2) A copy of each horse's registration paper.
- (3) Agent or lease papers, filed with NAPHA, if you are not the owner of record.
- (4) If you are showing in an Amateur Performance class, a signed copy of the Declaration of Amateur Status must be on file with NAPHA or filed with the Show Secretary prior to the start of the show. If you are showing in a Novice class, you must have a signed Novice Declaration on file with the NAPHA or Show Secretary prior to the start of the show.
- (5) A signed check, **payable to Cactus Classic** for the total amount of entry or you can indicate on your entry form credit card information. Pre-entries must be postmarked by April 17, 2025, to avoid late entry fees. **Credit Card fee of 3% will be charged.**

PAYMENT POLICY

- The Cactus Classic cannot extend credit of any kind to anyone—
 NO EXCEPTIONS.
- All entries must be paid in full by cash, check, money order or cashier's check at the time the entry is submitted. A valid credit card may be used as payment by entering the appropriate information on the entry form.
- Upon picking up the exhibitor packet prior to the start of classes, please open a show account and leave an open check or credit card information to cover any additional fees incurred during the show.
- · Any entry received without proper payment and/or copies of registration papers will be considered incomplete and may therefore be subject to Late Fees.
- LATE & POST ENTRIES: Entries postmarked after the close date of April 17, 2025, must pay \$30.00 per horse late entry fee. Any entries received that are not complete by the entry deadline will also pay the fee. Post class entries will be allowed up to THREE classes prior to the class being entered with no additional late charge.
- If an exhibitor desires to add classes, horses or any other expenses during the show, these must be paid immediately or the Show Secretary will bill the account.
- If the owner/exhibitor does not come to the office to close the account before the end of the show, the account will be closed by the Show Secretary and an invoice will be forwarded to the email on record for the account.
- Anyone owing a debt 60-days past due from the date of the first billing to NAPHA, or one of its approved shows may not be allowed to show in a NAPHA approved show in any capacity, including owner, trainer, rider, handler. An exhibitor who owes an outstanding debt to LAPPC or CSPPC for any reason will NOT be allowed to exhibit his/her horse until the balance is paid in full.

RETURNED CHECKS:

There will be a \$75.00 penalty if a check is refused by the bank for any reason. Anyone with a history of bad checks or show payments with LAPPC or CSPPC will be required to pay in cash or with a credit card UP FRONT. **NO EXCEPTIONS!**



STABLING

Stalls will be reserved based on the following criteria.

Cactus Classic Championship Show Sponsors will be given priority barn placement based on PAID ENTRY. If you would like to be a Cactus Sponsor, contact Joline at (760) 963-2340 directly to arrange and pay for your barn placement now.

After April 17th, barn placements will then be released first to those who have purchased and paid for show advertising and/or class sponsorships, and then in the order in which paid entries are received. We will try to accommodate every request to the best we are able while making sure show sponsors are given priority.

Horses that are brought to the show grounds, but are not entered in the show, must pay the appropriate stall or grounds fees and the \$40.00 office fee. No exceptions.

Important information regarding stall assignments: Groups wishing to be stabled together are required to send in the ENTIRE group of completed entries as soon as possible. A single check should be made payable to Cactus Classic and can cover the entire group of stalls. Late entries to the group cannot be assured of a stall assignment with the group but will be accommodated as close to the group as possible. Please list ranch name as well as trainer to avoid confusion. Include a phone number in case we have to call for additional information for your group.

STALL BEDDING: There will not be any bedding provided with stalls. NO OUTSIDE SHAVINGS ARE PERMITTED. If you bring in your own shavings and/or bedding, WestWorld will impose a \$250.00 fine for a first offense and will ban you from the grounds for any subsequent offense. All shavings must be pre-ordered or purchased during the show directly from the Feed & Bedding Office on site. Call the Feed and Bedding Office at 480-312-6814.

STALL DECORATIONS: All end stalls may be decorated and we encourage creativity. Remember that, per WestWorld rules, stalls may not be structurally altered in any way. Exhibitors will be financially responsible for any damage to stalls or premises. ABSOLUTELY NO NAILS OR SCREWS IN STALL WALLS!

GROUNDS/TRAILER FEES: The fee for those showing out of a trailer is \$40.00 per horse, per day.

WEATHER RELATED ISSUES: The Show Management may make some changes to the show schedule if necessary: ie heat or rain. We will keep a list of all exhibitors, trainers, owners and interested parties and will update via text message in advance of any changes. Please register any phone numbers with the show secretary to keep the message list updated.

CONDUCT: The Cactus Classic Peruvian Horse Championship Show is being conducted for the enjoyment of our Peruvian aficionados and according to the Horse Protection Act of 1970. Exhibitors, owners, trainers, agents and spectators are reminded that any unethical, unsafe or discourteous acts will not be tolerated. Without being held liable for damage of any kind, the Show Management may have the full power to exclude any person from the grounds if found in violation.

GOLF CART RENTALS: Email Michele Wilson rmicada@aol.com for information and availability. NOTE: Minors are not allowed to drive any motorized vehicles of any kind unless they possess a valid driver's license. This includes motorized scooters and/or utility vehicles.

NOTES ON ENTRIES

SUBSTITUTION OF ENTRIES/REFUNDS: If a horse is entered and then is unable to perform, another horse may be substituted at no additional cost. Refunds will be considered only if a veterinarian's certificate is submitted to the Show Secretary before the close of the show. The Show Manager has the final authority on refunds. No refunds will be approved until after the close of the show.

OFFICE FEE: If a horse is entered, with or without fees, and then withdrawn from competition for any reason, the office fee will still apply.

PAST CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS: When entering a returning Champion into the Champion of Champions class, please note how the horse is qualified to enter (e.g. 2010 National Champion of Champions or 2011 LAPPC Ch of Ch). Any returning Champion of Champions must enter the Zootenchico class. Past NAPHA US National Ch of Ch & PHAC National Ch of Ch may enter directly to their respective Champion of Champions class at this show.

ENTRY FORM: Must be signed by the registered owner of the horses, trainer, handler, and rider. Agents may only sign if the agent form (or copy) is provided with entry.

REGISTRATION PAPERS: All entries must include a copy of the current registration papers for each horse. Papers must be issued from NAPHA or PHAC, in accordance with NAPHA show approval guidelines. NOTE: For all male horses, shown in any bit class, registration papers must be provided which indicate Stallion or Gelding, as outlined in NAPHA rules. NO MALE (T) REGISTERED HORSE WILL BE ALLOWED ENTRY IN a 4+ BIT CLASS AT THIS SHOW! Registration must be correct before entry!

RESPONSIBILITY: It is the responsibility of the owner or agent of each horse to complete the entry form in full. Each change of class, rider or handler should be made on a supplemental entry form provided at the show office. No horses should enter any classes without submission of these forms and fees paid in advance (with open check or credit card on file).

OWNER: The name on the certificate of ownership, issued by the NAPHA OR PHAC, and their minor children. If the horse is owned by a ranch, corporation, or a family trust the individuals' names must be registered with the NAPHA. Lessees will not be allowed to show leased horses in classes where only the owner is allowed to ride.

REFUNDS/STAKES PAYMENTS: Checks will be issued no later than 30-days following the close of the show.

HEALTH CERTIFICATES: All horses arriving from out of Arizona must have health certificates issued within 30 days of the show. WestWorld requires ALL horses have a Coggins issued within 12 months. If you are traveling from Canada, please be aware of all the requirements of crossing at the US/Canada border.

GENERAL INFORMATION & SHOW RULES

JUDGE: If, for any reason, the judge fails to attend this show or perform his/her duties, the Show Committee reserves the right to substitute the judge with another qualified judge. No one shall approach a judge at any time without first obtaining permission from the Show Steward who shall arrange an appointment with the judge at a proper time and place. NAPHA rules prohibit any act or remark during the show which is considered offensive and/or made with intent to influence or cast aspersions on the judging.

JUDGE'S AUTHORITY: The judge has the authority to place a horse as he/she feels the horse merits and to excuse horses that are unsound, do not gait, are ill-mannered, or create a safety hazard. The judge shall rank entrants from first through reserve (entries permitting) without vacating any places.

ADMISSION TO THE RING: No person will be permitted to enter the ring except class participants, the judge, his/her assistants and Show Officials. Attendants and grooms may enter the ring only when summoned by order of the judge. Attendants entering the ring must be dressed in appropriate white clothing.

THREE MINUTE RULE & TACK CHANGES: The three-minute rule will be strictly enforced. Three minutes after the first horse in a class enters the ring, the gate will be closed and judging will begin. A 5-minute extension can be granted if the entrant notifies the show office or gate steward prior to the final class call. **Exhibitors are cautioned to plan classes to avoid the need for requests for extensions.**

SCRATCHED CLASSES/RIDER CHANGES: All scratches and rider changes MUST be made to the Show Office three classes prior. Class Substitutions for the same horse will be allowed. No refund for scratched classes without vet excuse. Classes may be substituted for the same horse. You will not be permitted to add classes at the gate!

ARRIVAL & DEPARTURE OF HORSES: Stalls will be available from 8:00 a.m. Wednesday, May 7TH through Monday, May 12^{th,} 10:00 am. Arrivals prior to that, or late departure on Monday, May 10TH, must contact the Barn Manager to make arrangements and must pay a \$45.00 per stall fee.

Dogs: DOGS MUST BE ON A LEASH AT ALL TIMES. Dogs will not be allowed in buildings or in arenas, this includes the competition arena and the warm up arena. This is for the safety of all exhibitors, spectators and horses. **Please respect this rule**.

ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES: Alcoholic beverages of any kind are not permitted on the premises unless they are provided by the City of Scottsdale or its contract vendor. **Please comply with this rule**.

OTHER SPECIFIC WESTWORLD RULES

WestWorld is owned and operated by the City of Scottsdale. City facilities can be used but at the owner's own risk. The City is not responsible for any personal injury or personal property damage on the premises. Smoking is prohibited in the barn and stall area. The use of electric, open flame or space heaters is forbidden. **PARKING:** No parking is allowed in unauthorized barn areas. Parking is allowed for unloading and loading only. The Barn Manager will direct drivers of rigs to the designated parking area for trailers. The City reserves the right to repair any damage to stalls and/or barns and shall bill for the repairs.

NOTES ON CLASSES

STAKES CLASSES: Stakes classes will be run under Breeding/Luxury rules. Monetary prizes will be awarded to 1st through 3rd Place. Purse for Luxury Gelding Stakes will be \$500.00 with entry fees added in. Purse for AOTR Stakes will be \$300.00 with entry fees added in. 50% to 1st Place, 30% to 2nd Place, 20% to 3rd Place.

CHAMPIONSHIP & BEST OF CLASS ENTRY: Horses which win first or second place in a qualifying regular class will be automatically entered by the Show Secretary & will be charged the Champion/Reserve class fee. Entry is not mandatory but an owner who elects not to enter must notify the Show Secretary, or else they will automatically be charged the class entry fee. Previous *LAPPC* and *CSPPC Champions* and *LAPPC*, *CSPPC and US National NAPHA & PHAC National Champion of Champions* may enter directly into their Champion of Champion Division. Returning Champions must be pre-entered no later than the start of classes on May 9th or will be charged an additional late entry fee of \$50.00. You may qualify for Champion of Champions at the 2025 Cactus Classic Show or enter as a returning Champion. You cannot do both.

ALTERNATIVE ATTIRE is allowed in all Performance Divisions AMATEUR PERFORMANCE, NOVICE, OPEN CLASSES: This is NOT mandatory and is NOT permitted for Breeding or Gait Divisions. It is only an option for those who would like to try something different!

- Hat must be of Peruvian style as outlined by NAPHA rules.
- Blazer or suit-style vest MUST be worn. Bolero jackets ok. No ponchos.
- Boots/belts in colors outlined in NAPHA rules. Boots may be worn outside of pants. If under/inside of pants, pants must be long enough to cover ankle and boot tops.
- Polinas & Half Chaps allowed.
- Split skirts/sidesaddle aprons for women as provided for in NAPHA rules.
- Shirts must be collared, long-sleeve as per NAPHA rules.
- Scarves/ties include traditional Peruvian white scarf, bolo tie, western crisscross tie, necktie or brooch.
- Colors allowed are: Black, shades of grey (charcoal to light), browns (dark to tan/beige, khaki), shades of muted greens (olive to hunter), blues (light to dark navy), burgundy (no bright reds or pinks), white, creams, ivory. Small pinstripes for jackets as outlined in NAPHA rules is acceptable. NO BLUE DENIM.

WESTERN PERFORMANCE 4+ CLASS: It is the position of the Cactus Classic Show Management that appropriate Western clothing may be worn for the Western Performance 4+, Class 37. This will be in line with the clothing worn by exhibitors at shows for other breeds that have Western Performance classes. Neon colors are not allowed. Hobbles are not required.

- 1) Western Tack Headgear & Saddle: Western Type saddle with horn. Any Western style headstall without noseband in conjunction with any standard Western style bit as long as the shank is not over 6" is allowed. A Peruvian bit may be used with an approved Peruvian chain on the Western headstall. Any device of wire, metal or rawhide with, or as part of, a leather curb strap is prohibited. Split reins or closed reins with romal are acceptable. Optional appointments include spurs, breast collar, rain slicks, tapaderos. Prohibited appointments are running or standing martingales, tiedowns, choke, ropes, draw reins, and bozal or cavesson type nosebands.
- 2) Western Attire: Western hat; long sleeved shirt consisting of a collar with buttons or snaps; a necktie, kerchief, or bolo tie; trousers or pants (a one-piece equitation suit is acceptable.) A zipper is permissible under buttons or snaps in either shirt or shirt post of suit. A belt and boots must be included. Riding gloves, chaps, shotgun chaps or chinks, spurs, jackets and/or vests are optional.

NEW THIS YEAR - HOBBY HORSE COMPETITION

HOBBY HORSE COMPETITION: Please register for this class with the Show Secretary at the time that you complete your entry. We want to have a sufficient number of ponies available so it's important that we have an idea in advance of the show. Ponies can be personalized and ribbons, reins, and halter will be provided. All ponies will be named, tagged and kept in the office corral until the class on Saturday afternoon, after lunch. Maneuvers will be called for the exhibitors (ie: enter at a flat walk, best gait, circle, simple serpentine, reverse direction, maybe more)... BE PREPARED) Awards will be given.

ZOOTECNICO: It is the NAPHA requirement that geldings, mares and stallions in Breeding or Luxury Championships & Champion of Champion classes be entered into their respective Zootecnico Class.

JUNIOR CLASSES: Juniors are those individuals who have not yet reached their 18th birthday as of January 1ST of the year of the show. Junior Classes will be run as a single class. However, they will be judged separately, and separate awards will be presented for each age group. Retrancas must be removed from the saddle.

Helmets must be worn by all juniors 18 and under, this includes lead line kiddies.

JUNIOR EQUITATION: No ponchos allowed. Jackets are ok. Cones will not be called.

JUNIOR SHOWNMANSHIP IN BIT: Juniors to execute the pattern provided. No ponchos or jackets.

JUNIOR BAREBACK EQUITATION: Bareback pads are allowed but are optional. Ponchos are not allowed. Jackets are allowed. Cones will not be called.

AOTR Is Amateur Owner to Ride. The rider must be the registered owner of the horse. Lessees are not considered owner.

EQUITATION CLASSES: Equitation classes will not include serpentine maneuvers in any division. Equitation will focus on the rider's seat, hands, position, and movement with the horse.

PERUVIAN TACK & ATTIRE: Horse and rider should be in full Peruvian tack and attire including pellon and spurs. Horses will be shown in bit. Ponchos are required. This is judged as a breeding class and qualifies for the Breeding Mares, Stallions and Luxury Championships. This class is for exhibitors 18 years of age and older because retrancas are required.

PAIRS CLASS: Entries will be two horse and two rider combinations. The class will be run as a parade/performance class and maneuvers will be called. Riders are encouraged to make this class fun and the show welcomes costumes with corresponding or matching outfits, anything to make this your class. Ribbons will be awarded to 1st through 5th place. This class does not qualify for a championship.

OPEN PERFORMANCE CLASSES: Backing is the only required maneuver as defined in NAPHA rule book. Performance classes will be run with maneuvers at the judges' and show's discretion for time consideration. Expect advanced serpentines and maneuvers (ie: side pass, turn on forehand, offset cones, etc.) in Championship level classes.

AMATEUR PERFORMANCE: Only Amateur riders are permitted to enter the Amateur Performance Classes. Maneuvers for both levels will include work on the rail, in a flat walk or a paso llano, circles, backs, straight line serpentines as well as other maneuvers.

AMATEUR PERFORMANCE LEVEL 1 & 2 CLASSES DEFINITION

LEVEL 1: The Exhibitor/Rider has NOT won more than 15 combined Champion and/or Champion of Champion titles from any NAPHA or PHAC approved show in Amateur Performance and/or open breeding/luxury classes in the previous 10 years. (Gait & AOTR classes excluded.)

LEVEL 2: The Exhibitor/Rider has WON more THAN 15 COMBINED Champion and/or Champion of Champion titles from any NAPHA or PHAC approved show, in AMATEUR performance and/or open breeding/luxury classes or has returned to amateur status from a professional status, in the previous 10 years. (Gait & AOTR classes excluded.)

NOTE: If a horse qualifies for a Champion/Reserve & Champion of Champion class with a Level 1 rider, only a Level 1 rider can complete competition in that division. A returning Champion of Champion must choose the level they will compete in and cannot change levels although different Level 1 riders can compete on the same horse for that division. If a horse qualifies in the amateur division with riders of both level 1 & Level 2, they can only compete in championships of one level and must stay with that level rider in Champion and Champion of Champion. IE: wins Champion Level 2, can only compete in Ch of Ch Level 2.

If an Exhibitor/Rider who qualifies as a Level 1 & chooses to compete at level 2, he/she cannot return to a Level 1 status. Levels cannot be changed during a show.

If an Exhibitor/Rider starts the year as a level 1 rider, but surpasses the 15 combined Champion and/or Ch of Ch titles during the show year, they are allowed to compete at a Level 1 for the remainder of the current show year.

Amateur Declaration must be filed with NAPHA or the Show Secretary.

Any exhibitor who is a current NAPHA carded judge must declare Level 2.

NAPHA rules pertaining to Amateur/Professional and Novice rules:

Anyone competing in a class or Division declared for "Amateurs" only must have a signed NAPHA Amateur Declaration on file with the NAPHA, or filed with the show secretary, prior to the start of the show that morning of the class entered. Amateurs must file annually. Regardless of one's equestrian skills and/or accomplishments, a person is an amateur if after their 18th birthday they have not engaged in any of the activities identified in PART X Glossary of Terms, Section 10 Professional, of the NAPHA Show Rules, Every person who has reached his/her 18th birthday and competes in classes for amateurs under NAPHA rules must be listed on the NAPHA website as an Amateur or have signed a NAPHA Amateur Declaration and filed with the show secretary, prior to the start of the show that morning of the class entered. Amateur status will be issued only on receipt of the application properly signed and is revocable at any time for cause. Any person who has not reached his/her 18th birthday is an amateur and does not require amateur status. See PART X GLOSSARY OF TERMS for complete definition of Amateur and Professional, of the NAPHA Show.

NOVICE CLASSES: Anyone competing in a class or Division declared for "Novices" only must have a signed NAPHA Novice Declaration on file with the NAPHA, or with the show secretary, prior to the start of the show. Novices must file this form annually. An exhibitor (18 years and older) can compete in the Novice Division for a period of 3 years. If the Novice, at the end of 3 years, has not competed in more than 8 NAPHA approved shows during that period may extend the time period for another 3 years (double shows count as one show). However, if at any time, a Novice competes and wins a Champion title in gait, breeding, or performance (any other Division above the level of Novice) they will be immediately excluded from competing in the Novice Division at future show.

PHOTOGRAPHY: Only professional photographer(s) and videographer(s) are allowed to photograph or video horses. Only the official show photographer has the exclusive rights to sell or distribute images. Anyone with professional photography equipment will not be allowed to photograph horses inside the show arena or from the arena rails during the show. Anyone not following these requirements will be escorted from the show grounds. **NOTE:** You may photograph and/or video your OWN horse during the show, and you may also photograph and/or video your horses at the barns and in the warm-up arena.

DIRECTIONS TO WESTWORLD

Please Note: WestWorld has 2 entrances for you to use. The Main Entrance is located just north of Frank Lloyd Wright Blvd on the north bound access road of SR-101. The north entrance is at 94th St and Bell Rd.

From the North (Flagstaff): I-17 South of SR-101 Loop – Eastbound into Scottsdale. Take the Pima/Princess exit. Make a left at Bell Rd (2nd light). Continue East on Bell Road, Turn right on 94th St. Travel south to the WestWorld entrance. Follow signs to RV Check-in. Just past RV check-in is the back gate into the stabling area.

Continue east on Bell Rd, Turn right on 94th St. Travel south to the WestWorld entrance. Follow signs to RV Check-in. Just past RV check-in in the back gate into the stabling area.
